NOTICE OF DESIGNATING BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 4th day of April 1984, enacted By-law Number 145-84 designating the lands and buildings known municipally as 310 Cooper Street as a property of architectural value or interest under the Ontarion Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 337.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION:

The one and one-half storey brick veneer structure at 310 Cooper Street is recommended for designation as being of architectural value. Erected in 1879-80 it is a pitched roof structure with its gabled end to the street. The building is highlighted by Victorian elements such as, a one storey bay window, arched window and door openings, an ornately cut bargeboard, and the use of a none course corbelled brick decorative band.

A by-law of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa to designate 310 Cooper Street to be of architectural value or interest;

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known as 310 Cooper Street more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the Ottawa Citizen newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive weeks, namely on December 20 and 27, 1980 and January 3, 1981;

AND WHEREAS notice of objection to the said proposed designation was served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

AND WHEREAS a Hearing was convened before the Conservation Review Board pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act;

AND WHEREAS by a Report dated November 24, 1983 the

Conservation Review Board recommended that 310 Cooper

Street be designated as a property of architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on March 21, 1984, considered the Report of the Conservation Review Board and confirmed the intention to designate;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as 310 Cooper Street.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owners of the property described in Schedule "A", and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa.
- 4. The schedules attached hereto and marked Schedule "A" and Schedule "B" form part of this by-law and all notations, references and other information contained therein shall be as much a part of this by-law as if all the matters and information set forth by the said schedules were all fully described herein.
