REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The building was erected in 1905. The building was the site of the first high school in the municipality. In 1962, following the construction of a new high school, the mission of the building was changed to house the Rockland Town Hall.

In addition to its historical value, the Town Hall is also architecturally significant. The Town Hall built in neo-georgian style is typical of the model used at the beginning of the century for the construction of institutional buildings. The structure is composed of wood that was manufactured at the former local sawmill. The building features the following: a four sloping surface tin roof joined by four hips crowned with a bell-tower, red clay brick bounded by red tinted mortar and a stone foundation.

Any person may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Rockland a notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation along with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts.
