BY-LAW NUMBER 478.77

To designate the Region of Peel Police Department Streetsville Station (Formerly the Old Streetsville Grammar School), at 327 Queen Street South of architectural value and of historic interest.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, S.O. 1974, Chapter 122, Section 29 (6), authorizes the council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the Region of Peel Police Department Streetsville Station (formerly the Old Streetsville Grammar School), at 327 Queen Street South having been duly published and served and no notice of objection to such designation having been received by the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga.

WHEREAS the reasons for the said designation are set out as Schedule 'A' hereto;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga enacts as follows:

1. That the real property, more particularly described in Schedule 'B' hereto, known as the Region of Peel Police Department Streetsville Station (formerly the Old Streetsville Grammar School), at 327 Queen Street South be designated as being of architectural and historic value or interest.

2. That the City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Mississauga.

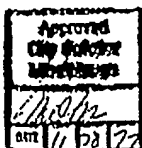

SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW NO. 478-77  
OF THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA

Reasons for the designation of the Region of Peel Police Department Streetsville Station (formerly the Old Streetsville Grammar School), at 327 Queen Street South.

The Region of Peel Police Department Streetsville Station (formerly the Old Streetsville Grammar School) is recommended for designation on architectural grounds as a good example of Italianate style architecture in public buildings. On historical grounds it is recommended for designation as the first grammar school in the Township of Toronto. Built in 1851 it continued in use as a school until 1951. In 1966 it became the Streetsville Town Hall and is currently a station for the Region of Peel Police Department.

SCHEDULE "B" TO  
BY-LAW NO. 478 OF THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the City of Mississauga Regional Municipality of Peel (formerly in the Town of Streetsville, County of Peel), Province of Ontario, and being composed of Lots 7 and 8 according to a plan registered in the Land Registry Office for the Registry Division of Peel (No. 43) as No. Str.3.
