Rescind and Replace Heritage Designation By-law 60-85, 50 Crawford Street, Brockville.

The Council for the City of Brockville intends to repeal and replace By-law 60-85, being a By-law designating 50 Crawford Street, Brockville, as being a property of cultural heritage value under Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

Why?

A portion of the 16.3-acre parcel (10.8-acres) has been tentatively sold. The current designation applies to the entire parcel, not only the built heritage elements, rendering the property as undevelopable.

City Council intend to rescind the designation on the northern 10.8 acres and designate only the southern 5.5 acres of the property which includes the main house, stable, coach house wall and chapel.

Built in 1859, 'Somerset' the Benjamin Chaffey House property has design value as a fine example of post-Gothic stone residence in a landscaped setting. 'Somerset' the Benjamin Chaffey House, has associative value for its connections with Benjamin Chaffy Jr., a civil engineer and contractor and credited for taking part in the building of the Brockville Courthouse, St. Paul's Anglican Church, the George Mallock House and the Alexander Morris House (formerly the Brockville Club), as well as, Victoria Bridge in Montreal and the first Morrisburg Ship Canal. The Chaffey family owned the property from 1853 to 1893. The property also has associative value for its connections with St. Alban's School and currently St. Alban's Riding Stables.
