## TOWNSHIP OF WELLESLEY

IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT R.S.O. 1980, CHAPTER 337 and in the matter of the lands and premises at the following municipal location in the province of Ontario;

## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wellesley intends to designate the property owned by Part Lot 12, Concession VI, West Section, Township of Wellesley, as a property of historic and architectural value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

The subject residence constructed in 1861 is located in Part Lot 12, Concession VI, W. S., Township of Wellesley within the Settlements Limits of Crosshill. The Belmont house as it is known was constructed by William Hastings who served as the local justice of the peace and is at present registered in the ownership of

The dedication is intended to apply to the north side facade of this two storey stone house. The north facade is characterized by its Gothic style, ashlar granite rectangular split stone, dignified by intricately carved sandstone quoins, and individualized by the large gothic window surmounted by a carved stone likeness of William Hastings.

The east side facade is also intended to be designated for its unique irregular field stone construction, 6 over 6 hung windows and the gable windowed porch section of the original house to which the Gothic section was later added.
