THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MARKHAM

BY-LAW NUMBER 81-92

A by-law to designate a certain property as
being of Historic and/or Architectural
value or interest

WHEREAS Section 29, Subsection 6 of the Ontario Heritage Act, Chapter 0.18, R.S.O. 1990 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate a real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic and/or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises at:

and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to designate The Buttonville Schoolhouse (S.S. No. 5, Markham Township), located on the west side of Woodbine Avenue, north of Valleywood Drive, Part of Lots 12 and 13, Concession 3, Town of Markham, Regional Municipality of York, designated as Part 2 on Plan 65R-15430,/ and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule 'A', attached hereto and forming part of this by-law;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MARKHAM HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 2 -

1. THAT the following real property, being The Buttonville Schoolhouse (S.S. No. 5, Markham Township), located on the west side of Woodbine Avenue, north of Valleywood Drive, Part of Lots 12 and 13, Concession 3, designated as Part 2 on Plan Town of Markham, Regional Municipality of York, 65R-15430/is hereby designated as being of historic and/or architectural value or interest;
2. THAT the Town Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described herein in the Land Registry Office.

READ A FIRST AND SECOND TIME THIS 26TH DAY OF MAY, 1992.



THE BUTTONVILLE SCHOOLHOUSE (S.S. NO.5)

Built in 1872, this one room, brick schoolhouse closely follows an 1857 building plan issued by the provincial education department. Tall, round-headed, double hung windows capped with radiating brick voussoirs and resting on stone sills indicate the building's Italianate style, as do pairs of console brackets under the eaves. Of interest, too, are circular motifs in gables, the date stone, separate girls' and boys' entrances and interior wainscotting.

A landmark in rapidly changing Buttonville, Buttonville Schoolhouse (S.S. No. 5) (closed in 1971) records a century of education in the community.
