TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as 7710 Kennedy Road, Markham as a property of architectural and/or historic interest or value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Benjamin Milliken House is recommended for designation for its historical and architectural significance.

The 2-storey brick structure, constructed c.1855, provides an excellent example of the Georgian architectural style with outstanding decorative brick details and is 1 of only 6 remaining heritage buildings from the former hamlet of Hagerman's Corners. Major Benjamin Milliken was active in the York Militia during the War of 1812 and the 1837 Rebellion and his family is the namesake for the area at Kennedy and Steeles.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served on the Town Clerk within thirty (30) days of the 13th day of November, 1993.
