**Notice of Intention to Designate**

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Cambridge intends to designate the exterior of the following properties of the architectural and historical significance under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Ch.0.18.

**300 Maple Grove Road**

This farm house, constructed in 1904, is a good example of the Queen Anne style of architecture. True to the style, the home features decorative wood shingles at the gable ends, carved wooden brackets, an oval window, a two storey projecting bay and several porches. This farm is part of the ever-diminshing number of rural properties remaining in Cambridge.

**18 Harvey Street  
St. Mathew's Cathedral**

1893?  
Constructed in 1883, this yellow brick church, is designed in the Ecclesiological Gothic Revival style of architecture. Lewis Kribs, a prominent local builder constructed this building. The church features a repeating lancet theme, buttresses, a tower and steeply pitched roofs. Once designated, it will be one of three churches in the City of Cambridge to be protected under the Ontario Heritage Act.

ANY PERSON MAY, within thirty days of this publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Cambridge, notice of his objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a notice is received the Council of the Corporation of the City of Cambridge shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
