BY-LAW NO. 1768

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OF THE

CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

A by-law to designate 329 Fountain Street South, Cambridge, Ontario, as being of architectural value and of historic interest.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS Notice of Intention to so designate the property, . including lands and buildings, known municipally as 329 Fountain Street South, Cambridge, Ontario, has been duly published and served; and

WHEREAS it is considered desirable to designate the property known as 329 Fountain Street South, Cambridge, Ontario.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historic value or interest, the exterior of the picturesque cottage in the vernacular classical style of the mid-nineteenth century located on the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto, known as 329 Fountain Street South, Cambridge, Ontario. The reasons for the designation are set out in Schedule "B" attached hereto.

2. The City of Cambridge is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the said property and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Cambridge.

SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW NO. 1768

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the City of Cambridge, in the Regional Municipality of Waterloo, (formerly in the City of Galt), and being composed of Part of Lot 16, Registered Plan 522, known municipally as 329 Fountain Street South, Cambridge, Ontario.

SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW NO. 1768

329 Fountain Street South is designated for architectural reasons. Built for the carpenter, John Forsyth, the house stands as a simple, picturesque, pink-yellow brick cottage in the vernacular classical style of the mid-nineteenth century in a good state of preservation. On the main facade the windows have double sashes of six over six panes and brick voussoirs and louvered shutters, on either side of the main door which is framed with plain, wood pilasters, sidelights, a rectangular transom light and much wood moulding.
