BY-LAW NO. 165-93

OF THE

CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

Being a by-law of the City of Cambridge to designate the main entrance gates to Riverside Park, Cambridge Ontario, as a structure of historical significance.

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1990, Chap. 0.18 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS Notice of Intention to so designate the main entrance gates to Riverside Park, Cambridge, Ontario, have been duly published and served;

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS: -

- THAT there is designated as being of historical significance the original structure, that being the main entrance gates to Riverside Park, located on the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto, known as Riverside Park, Cambridge, Ontario. The reasons for designation are as set out in Schedule "B" attached hereto.
- THAT the City of Cambridge is hereby authorized to cause a copy of 2. this by-law to be served upon the owner of the said property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Cambridge.

All and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate lying and being in the City of Cambridge, and in the Regional Municipality of Waterloo, formerly the Town of Preston, being composed of Beasley's Broken Front Concession Part Lot 20, on Registered Plan 730, and depicted as Parts 1 and 2 on Reference Plan 67R-3927 as attached to this by-law.

## CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

The entrance gates to Riverside Park are recommended for designation for historic reasons. Constructed between 1921 - 1922, the gates were to commemorate those soldiers from Preston who served in World War I. The entrance gates greet vehicular and pedestrian traffic from King Street. Although the gates have been substantially altered they are an important link to the City's past war efforts. According to the Official Plan the gates meet the following criteria:

### <u>Historical</u>

- it is associated with people who are recognized as having made significant contributions to the City's political, economic and physical development;
- (ii) it is directly associated with a historic event which is recognized as having local, regional, provincial, national and international significance; and
- (iii) it is a well preserved example and illustration of the City's cultural development.

### Architectural

(i) it makes an important contribution to the streetscape of which it forms a part.
