Dear Ontario Heritage Trust,

The Municipality of Brockton received a Notice of Application by Owner to Repeal Designation By-law under s. 32 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O.1990, c. O.18. on a property located at 12 Concession 10, Cargill, ON N0G 1J0, known as the Henry Cargill "White" House. The Council of the Municipality of Brockton provided notice of receipt of the Notice of Application to Repeal the Designation By-Law on January 15, 2025.

Several objections were received from members of the public, and the Brockton Heritage Committee, advocating maintaining the cultural heritage of the property and the significance of maintaining the monument to its original owner, Henry Cargill, who was the leading citizen of the village which came to bear his name. The Henry Cargill "White" House was one of the first designated properties in Brockton. The colour "white" appears specifically in the designation because Henry Cargill had two houses – a white house and a red house which burned down. In other words, the building has been known as the white house since the 1880's.

At their meeting on March 18, 2025 the Council of the Municipality of Brockton considered the objections submitted, and passed the enclosed resolution approving maintaining the heritage designation on the Henry Cargill "White" House, thereby refusing the owner's application to repeal the designation by-law.

If the owner of the property objects to Council's decision, the owner may appeal to the Tribunal by giving the Tribunal and the Clerk of the Municipality of Brockton, within 30 days after receipt of the notice, by providing a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the decision and the reasons in support of the objection, accompanied by the fee charged by the Tribunal.
