
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 15th day of September, 1980, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as Nos.2-6 Wellesley Cottages, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of Reasons for the Proposed Designation

Nos.2-6 Wellesley Cottages (row of houses) is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. This row of one-storey rough-cast workmen's cottages was built by Wm. T. Hooker in 1887-88 and their design was influenced by the popular Gothic Revival style. A prominent feature is the steeply-pitched gable with decorative bargeboards. The central front doorways with their flat arch transoms are flanked on either side by double-hung, 2 over 2 light, windows having similar flat arches and trim moldings. Located well inside the block on a lane away from the main thoroughfare of Wellesley Street East, this row of houses is one of the few remaining examples of working-class housing characteristic of the mid-to late 19th Century in Toronto.
