Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 4th day of February, 1976, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 41 Spruce Street, as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The former Trinity College Medical School (now being converted to housing), 41 Spruce Street. The former Trinity College Medical School (built c.1875) is recommended for designation on architectural and historical grounds as one of the oldest educational buildings in the City and one which is intimately involved with the history of medicine in Canada.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 13th day of February, 1976. (Reference File 1096).
