

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the
City of North York on the 20th day of September, 1982,
decided to designate the lands and building known
municipally as 25 Sheppard Avenue West as a property of
architectural and historic interest or significance
under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed
Designation:

The Sheppard-Carruthers House, 25 Sheppard Avenue West
is recommended for designation as a rare and excellent
example of vernacular Renaissance Revival styling, with
wooden pediments over each window and door, rustic
branch-like bargeboards, original interior trim and
modest clapboard siding. Its three-bay facade and
storey-and-a-half T-plan with centre gable was a common
form. Built about 1865 by Charles Sheppard, innkeeper
at the Golden Lion Tavern, it is also important for its
visual relationship with Dempsey's Store.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on
the City Clerk within thirty days of October 15, 1982.
