Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 14th day of May, 1979, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No. 35 Crescent Road, as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

No. 35 Crescent Road (The Boultbee House). This building is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. The house was designed by architect, S.H. Townsend, for Alfred Boultbee, Q.C., and built in 1895 on land that was part of the estate of Sir David L. Macpherson. In the early 1900's Boultbee's son, Alfred E. Boultbee, designed stone walls and, as the focus of the garden, a swimming pool enhanced by a Doric colonnade.

The two-storey house with Tudor Gothic characteristics exhibited in the wood detailing and brickwork, was built into the hillside of the Rosedale Valley in unique surroundings.
