
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 4th day of February, 1976, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 18 Orde Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Orde Street Public School. 18 Orde Street at Murray Street (NW). The Orde Street Public School (c.1910) is recommended for designation on architectural grounds for the significance of certain of its elements - notably the roof-top playground - as examples of the attempt, as part of the philosophy of the City Beautiful Movement, to develop a more healthful environment for downtown children.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 13th day of February, 1976. (Reference File 1056).
