NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 2nd day of June, 1978, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No.50 St. Joseph Street, as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

St. Basil's Church at 50 St. Joseph Street is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. The original Early English Gothic style building was erected, with the first wing of St. Michael's College, in 1856 from a design by the prominent architect, William Hay. There were substantial extensions in 1877, and the steeple was added in 1886 to designs by A.A. Post. The great Angelus bell was installed in 1895 and the vaulted ceiling in 1922. The Church stands on a section of "Clover Hill", the Elmsley family lands. It was donated to the Basilian Order by Captain John Elmsley. The Collegiate Church has been intimately connected with the life and education of many students and families that were its parishioners.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 16th day of June, 1978. (File 1518).
