REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

a) Architectural:

The Market Building is a large, attractive red brick building with stone trim and twin towers. The low roof and wide canopies are typical of market construction of the period. Incorporated into the roof are two dormers.

b) Historical


The Market was built in 1895 and is situated in a prominent position in the civic square. Over the years, it has provided a place on this site, where city meets country and friends meet friends. The building has served as a market, magistrate court and police station.

The Market Building is an important part of Woodstock's downtown and a unique resource to be maintained for our families futures.
