

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

Originally The Church of Christ, 58 Cecil Street, at Glasgow Street 1889, by Knox & Elliott of Chicago. The Church of Christ is recommended for designation as a good example of the Romanesque Revival style built by an important Chicago firm of architects. The building is also a local landmark, important in streetscape terms because of its position at the intersection of Cecil and Glasgow Streets in a closely-built residential district.
