NOTICE OF
INTENTION
TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation
of the Borough of York, on the 27th day of February,
1978, decided to designate the lands and building
known municipally as Number 64 King Street, in the
Borough of York, as property of historical and
architectural value or interest under The Ontario
Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario 1974,
Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the
Proposed Designation:

The above mentioned lands and building were
part of the property of William Tyrrell who was
prominent in the development of that portion of the
Borough of York, formerly known as the Town of
Weston, and was Reeve of York Township and Mayor
of Weston. The building on the aforesaid lands
was built by William Tyrrell in 1859 and has
historical and architectural value or interest.

Notice of objection to the designation may be
served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 9th
day of March, 1978.
