NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 30th day of April, 1984 decided to designate the lands and buildings known municipally as 67 Front Street East (Commercial Building) as a property of architectural and historical value or interest, under the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

Short Statement of Reasons for the Proposed Designation

The property at 67 Front Street East, which includes the convenience address, 69 Front Street East, is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. It was built in 1877 as a pair of commercial units with matching facades. Distinctive architectural elements of the building include a splayed corner chimney, a bracketed cornice, arched brick lintels with incised keystones, and the unusual double hung windows with decorative centre mullions. The original owner, for over twenty years, was the Honourable Sir Oliver Mowat, Premier of Ontario from 1872 to 1896. This building is an important part of the architectural heritage of nineteenth century Front Street East.

Notice of the Objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 15th day of May, 1984.
