Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of
the City of Toronto, on the 4th day of February, 1976, decided
to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as
89 St. George Street, as a property of architectural value
or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O.
Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The W.D. Matthews House (now the Newman Centre), 89
St. George Street at Hoskin Avenue (NE). The W.D. Matthews
House, built in 1890 and extended in 1899 by G.M. Miller, is
recommended for designation on architectural grounds as the
work of an important Toronto architect. The interiors of
the ground floor of the house are also of importance as intact
examples of the interior design of the late nineteenth century.
The ballroom, added in 1899, is an outstanding example of co-
ordinate design in the Art Nouveau by the Toronto sculptor
Gustav Hahn.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served
on the Clerk within thirty days of the 10th day of March, 1976.
