No. 635-84. A BY-LAW

To repeal By-law No. 46-83 respecting the designation of the Property at No. 88 Queen Street East of architectural value and of historic interest.

(Passed September 4, 1984.)

Whereas the Council of the City at its meeting held on March 7, 1983 refused the application to demolish the designated property at No. 88 Queen Street East in accordance with Section 34 of the Ontario Heritage Act and prohibited any work to demolish or remove any building or structure on the Property for a period of 180 days from the date of its decision;

And Whereas in early 1983 the 180 day period expired;

And Whereas by April 5, 1984 the demolition of the building at No. 88 Queen Street East had been completed;

And Whereas subsection 34(5) of the Ontario Heritage Act states that where the 180 day period has expired and the demolition of the building has been completed, the Council shall pass a by-law repealing the designating by-law;

Therefore, the Council of The Corporation of the City of Toronto enacts as follows:

- 1. By-law No. 46-83, being "A By-law To designate the Property at No. 88 Queen Street East of architectural value and of historic interest." is hereby repealed.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A", annexed hereto in the proper land registry office.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause a notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Toronto, and cause the reference to the property to be deleted from the Register referred to in subsection 27(1) of the Ontario Heritage Act.
