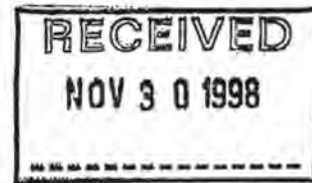



**NOTICE OF PASSING OF BY-LAW**

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Essex has passed by-law number 2499 to designate the following property as being of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122;

- (a) 18 Gordon Avenue

**CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ESSEX  
BY-LAW NO. 2499**

---

**A by-law to designate the lands and premises situate within the Town of Essex, known as Essex Library, 18 Gordon Avenue, in the Town of Essex, to be of architectural and/or historic value or interest under the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, as amended.**

**WHEREAS** by virtue of the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, as amended, the Council of a municipality may, by by-law, designate a property within the municipality to be of history or architectural value or interest;

**AND WHEREAS** upon consideration of the recommendation of Heritage Essex Inc., The Corporation of the Town of Essex deems it desirable and expedient to designate Lot 202 and Lot 204, Registered Plan 176, municipally known as 18 Gordon Avenue, Essex to be of historic or architectural value or interest, for the reasons stated in Schedule "A" annexed hereto and forming part of this by-law.

**AND WHEREAS** notice of intention to so designate the subject property was served on the owner of the subject property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and such notice was published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once a week for three consecutive weeks;

**AND WHEREAS** no notice of objection was served on the Clerk of the Corporation.

**THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Essex enacts as follows:

1. That the above defined subject property be and the same is hereby designated to be of architectural and/or historic value or interest.

2. That this by-law shall come into force and effect after the final passing thereof on the day upon which it is registered in the Land Registry Office for Essex (No. 12).

**READ** a first and second time this       day of November, 1998,.

**READ** a third and final time and passed this       day of November,

## SCHEDULE "A"

### REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

Essex Carnegie Library - 18 Gordon Avenue, Essex

#### Historical

The Essex Library is a Carnegie Library, which provided a permanent structure for the local library begun 29 years earlier, and after great lobbying efforts by the local community.

#### Architectural

A typical Carnegie library, built c. 1914.

The exterior facade of the building, front and side elevations and hip roof are identifiable as a Carnegie library.
