

CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ESSEX BY-LAW NO. 2499

A by-law to designate the lands and premises situate within the Town of Essex, known as Essex Library, 18 Gordon Avenue, in the Town of Essex, to be of architectural and/or historic value or interest under the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, as amended.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O.

1990, Chapter 0.18, as amended, the Council of a municipality may, by by-law,
designate a property within the municipality to be of history or architectural value
or interest:

AND WHEREAS upon consideration of the recommendation of Heritage Essex Inc., The Corporation of the Town of Essex deems it desirable and expedient to designate Lot 202 and Lot 204, Registered Plan 176, municipally known as 18 Gordon Avenue, Essex to be of historic or architectural value or interest, for the reasons stated in Schedule "A" annexed hereto and forming part of this by-law.

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the subject property
was served on the owner of the subject property and upon the Ontario Heritage
Foundation, and such notice was published in a newspaper having general
circulation in the municipality once a week for three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection was served on the Clerk of the Corporation.

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Essex enacts as follows:

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

Essex Carnegie Library - 18 Gordon Avenue, Essex

Historical

The Essex Library is a Carnegie Library, which provided a permanent structure for the local library begun 29 years earlier, and after great lobbying efforts by the local community.

Architectural

A typical Carnegie library, built c. 1914.

The exterior facade of the building, front and side elevations and hip roof are identifiable as a Carnegie library.
