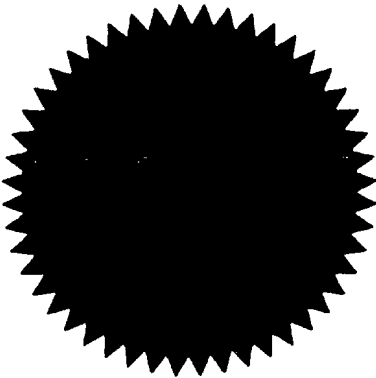
By-law Number (1995)-14918
