BY-LAW NO. 43 for 1980

Being a by-law to designate certain properties of historic or architectural value or interest

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, as amended, authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest, and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Seaforth has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premises known as the Cardno Block, 39-47 Main Street, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation; notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused said notice of intention to designate to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality, once for each of three consecutive weeks, and

WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto, and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Seaforth enacts as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest, more particularly described in Schedule "B" attached hereto, the property known as The Cardno Block.
- 2. McConnell, Stewart and Devereaux are hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "B" attached hereto, in the proper land registry office.
- The Town Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owners of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having, general circulation in the Town of Seaforth.

Read a first and second time this 15th day of December, 1980.

Read a third time and finally passed this 15th day of December, 1980.

### SCHEDULE "A"

#### REASON FOR DESIGNATION:

A. The Cardno Block - A two storey buff brick building built in 1877 has a distinctive mansard roof with a clock tower which stands 68 feet high making a major landmark. The exterior cladding of the mansard roof and clock tower is slate tile. The second floor facade has seven Romanesque / Italiante styled windows. There are five small round windows on the mansard roof including the one in the clock tower.
