CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HALDIMAND

BY-LAW NUMBER 85-17

BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN  
MUNICIPALLY AS RUSS'S CREEK CEMETERY  
AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND/OR HISTORICAL  
VALUE OR INTEREST

WHEREAS section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Haldimand has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as RUSS'S CREEK CEMETERY

at LOT 4, CONC. 7, HALDIMAND TOWNSHIP, COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND

and upon

the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality; and

WHEREAS the Council has considered the report of the Appointed Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee (LACAC)

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Haldimand enacts as follows:

1) There is designated as being of architectural and/or historical value or interest the real property known as RUSS'S CREEK CEMETERY

RUSS'S CREEK CEMETERY

at Lot 4, Conc. 7, HALDIMAND TOWNSHIP, COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND,

more particularly described in schedule A hereto.

2) The municipal solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule A hereto in the proper land registry office.

3) The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

RUSS'S CREEK CEMETERY

---

Lot 4, Conc. 7, Haldimand Township, County of Northumberland

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE:

The Russ's Creek Cemetery is an abandoned Pioneer Cemetery of Historical significance. The land was petitioned to James Farr, on July 4th, 1795 by His Excellency John Graves Simcoe, Lieutenant Governor, General and Commander in Chief of the Province of Upper Canada.

The earliest burial appears to be a "Sarah Bradley," dated April 11, 1840. The last burial appears to be "Henry Porter" dated June 30, 1943.

The Pioneer family names are:- HILL, PRATT, RITCHIE, RUSS, HARTFORD, BRIGHT, WHITE, KIRKLAND, LONG, PROUT, PORTER, MILLER, THURSTON, SPINKS, BESTHERWICK, COCKS, RICHEY, CARPENTER, TUNNEY, BRADLEY, SWEET, FOX, JOICE, BULL, GRAHAM.
