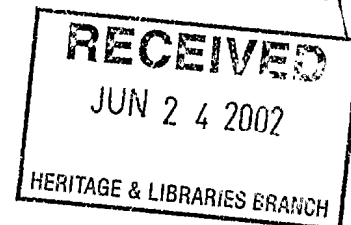

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF SAULT STE. MARIE

BY-LAW NO. 2002-37

HISTORIC SITES: (L.5.2.7.) A by-law to designate the property at 64 Church Street as being of architectural or historic value or interest.

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. 337 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie has caused to be served on the owners of the lands known as 64 Church Street and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS no objections to the proposed designations have been served on the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie, pursuant to the Ontario Heritage Act ENACTS as follows:


1. **PROPERTIES DESIGNATED**

Part of land south of Lot 12 west of Luscombe Street and Part of Water Lots in front of Park Lot 24, first concession in the former Township of St. Mary's being more particularly described as Part 3, Plan 1R-9947.
