TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie intends to designate the property at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, chapter O.18.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION - 426 Queen Street East

It is recommended that the structure known as the Sault Ste. Marie Courthouse situated at 426 Queen Street East and its three major interior features, namely the central staircase, the glass ceiling and Courtroom Number 1 be designated as having heritage significance under the Ontario Heritage Act Part IV because of the many unique characteristics found in this property. Its architectural significance is a fine example of Beaux-Arts Classicism style. This includes symmetrical styling, ornamental wrought iron and hardwood railing on the staircase balustrade, a glass ceiling with a circular decorative motif and an imposing courtroom with classical double cube dimensions.

NOTICE of objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie before the 3rd day of August, 2004.
