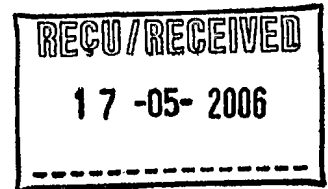

HERITAGE DESIGNATION

IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER O.18 AND IN THE MATTER OF THE LAND AND PREMISES AT 269 QUEEN STREET EAST, SAULT STE. MARIE IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie intends to designate the property at the following municipal address as a property of cultural heritage value and interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, chapter O.18.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION **SAULT STE. MARIE MEMORIAL TOWER**

It is recommended that the structure known as the Sault Ste. Marie Memorial Tower situated at 269 Queen Street East be designated as having cultural heritage value and interest under the Ontario Heritage Act Part IV because it is a late Canadian example of the Moderne style architecture. It contains the records of the men and women who served in the Armed Forces in the two World Wars and in Korea. The imaginatively designed Memorial Tower is a visual focus and a significant component of the streetscape along Queen Street.

NOTICE of objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie before the 21st day of June, 2006.
