

Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Canadian Pacific Railway Express Building, 62-66, 63-88 Simcoe Street (NW) through to King Street West. The Canadian Pacific Express Building built 1912-1913, is recommended for designation as a notable example of an industrial building that was given dignity, and a style appropriate to a major city street, by the use of the classically derived Beaux Arts style. The building is also important in the streetscape as one of the three surviving units of the grouping on the corners of King and Simcoe Streets.
