REASON FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

"The Robert Gibbons House". The Robert Gibbons House is recommended for historical and architectural reasons. The Gibbons house is a cubic Georgian structure. It is constructed of cut stone, in tapering thickness from 3 ft at the base to 1½ ft. at the second level, covered on the interior by split lath and plaster. Cut locally, the dressed stone on the front facade comes from the Maitland River. The front facade has been restored to its original appearance. Other details include three of four symmetrically placed chimneys on a square, low hipped roof; six over six windows and a front door with side and transom lites.
