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to designate the Stirling House at 100 Dunsford Drive of architectural value.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate a real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Borough of Scarborough has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known as the Stirling House at 100 Dunsford Drive and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "8" hereto; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE BOROUGH OF SCARBOROUGH ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as the Stirling House at 100 Dunsford Drive.

2. The Borough Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office. 3. The Borough Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the Borough of Scarborough.

This stone house constructed in 1860, has a unique black and white stonework pattern with chiselled limestone lintels and cornerstones, and illustrates the excellent stone workmanship of the period.
