
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 8th and 10th days of May, 1978, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No.111 Maitland Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

111 Maitland Street (formerly the Society of Friends' Meeting House, now the National Ballet School). The Building is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. Built in 1911 as a Meeting House for the Society of Friends, it is a notable example of a simple and humane use of the classical form of architecture. The pedimented portico is of the Tuscan Order with a stepped podium. The doorway and semicircular arched windows on all elevations are special features of the building.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 19th day of May, 1978. (File 1478).
