Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of  
the City of North York on the 30th day of April,  
1979, decided to designate the lands and building  
known municipally as 4169 Bathurst Street as a  
property of architectural and historic value or  
interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974,  
S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed  
Designation.

The John Bales House, 4169 Bathurst Street, is  
recommended for designation for architectural and  
historic reasons. It is an excellent example of  
early Ontario Vernacular architecture, and the only  
two-storey hand-hewn log house left standing in  
North York. Although the symmetrical plan and  
appearance derive from the Georgian style, the  
small scale of the home is closer to the simple  
rural peasant cottage of 18th century Britain.  
The house is the pioneer homestead of John and Mary  
Bales whose descendants played prominent roles in  
the City's social, economic and political development.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served  
on the City Clerk within thirty days of December 22nd,  
1980.
