NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 12th day of April, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No.471 Jarvis Street, as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The house at 471 Jarvis Street is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons and in context with the adjacent houses to the south. Built in 1875, it is a fine example of eclectic second Empire domestic architecture featuring intricate wood detailing, ornate dormers and iron cresting. From 1910 until 1941 it was occupied by St. Joseph's High School for Girls.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 22nd day of April, 1977. (File 1297).
