NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 1st day of October, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 412-448 Younge Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The T. Eaton Co. Limited (Eaton's College Street), 412-448
Yonge Street at Hayter Street, through to 49 College Street (1917) 1928-33
by Ross & Macdonald; Sproat & Rolph, Associates. The Eaton's College
Street store is recommended for designation for architectural reasons
as a notable example (though unfinished) of the type of large scale
building using simplified classical forms that typifies commercial
design in the 1920s and 1930s. The building coordinates the finest
materials and workmanship with a scale rarely seen in Canada or in the
work of Canadian architects. The building is also important because
it effectively defines the intersection of Yonge and College Streets
setting the tone and scale for many of the buildings in the area.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of October 10th, 1975.
