Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 21st day of May, 1985 decided to designate the lands and buildings known municipally as 459 and 461 Sackville Street as a property of architectural value or interest, under the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

Short Statement of Reasons for the Proposed Designation

The property at 459, 461 Sackville Street is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. The polychromatic brick building is representative of the typical neighbourhood corner store of the late 19th century. When built in 1888, the simple house form building included two stores, one for a grocer and the other for a butcher with residential accommodations above. The storefront glazing and full canopy distinguish it from the neighbouring houses. The L-shaped porch with wood posts and decorative treillage forming the canopy is unique in the City and a prominent local landmark.

Notice of Objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 4th day of June, 1985.
