



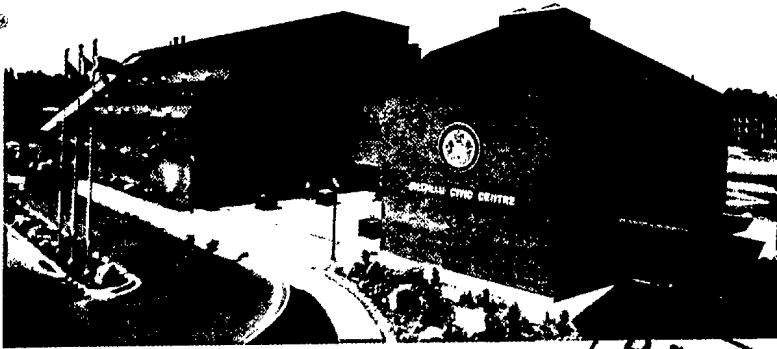



OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CHATHAM

BY-LAW NUMBER 8479

OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CHATHAM

A By-law to designate the property known municipally as 59 William Street North as being of historical and/or architectural value or interest.

FINALLY PASSED the 12th day of March A.D. 1984.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337 as amended, enables municipalities to enact by-laws to designate property, (which term means real property and includes all buildings and structures thereon) to be of architectural or historical value or interest.

AND WHEREAS Council of The Corporation of the City of Chatham, having appointed a Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee, has consulted with the said Committee prior to giving Notice of its Intention to Designate the hereinafter described property pursuant to Section 29 of the said The Ontario Heritage Act.

AND WHEREAS Council of The Corporation of the City of Chatham has caused Notice of Intention to Designate the hereinafter described property to be of historical or architectural value or interest pursuant to the said The Ontario Heritage Act and has duly served such Notice of Intention and published the same as required by law.

AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been received by The Corporation of the City of Chatham.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of Chatham as follows:

1. The property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto annexed, be and the same is hereby designated to be of historical or architectural value or interest, pursuant to the said The Ontario Heritage Act.

SCHEDULE "A"

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Chatham, in the County of Kent, and Province of Ontario and being composed of Part of Lot Number Twenty-three (23) on William and Murray Streets in said City and being more particularly known and described as follows; that is to say: COMMENCING at the northwest angle of said lot; THENCE south twenty degrees east (S 20⁰ E) Forty-eight (48') feet along the easterly limit of William Street; THENCE north seventy degrees east (N 70⁰ E) One Hundred and Four (104') feet to lands owned and occupied by one William Douglas; THENCE north twenty degrees west (N 20⁰ W) Forty-eight (48') feet to the southerly limit of Murray Street; THENCE south seventy degrees west (S 70⁰ W) along the southerly limit of Murray Street One Hundred and Four (104') feet to the place of beginning.

The hereinbefore described lands are now known and designated as property #00502-105.

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

The Chatham-Kent Museum
59 William Street North
CHATHAM, Ontario

The Chatham-Kent Museum architecturally is referred to as the Nameless Vernacular of the 1880's and 90's characterized by gable brackets, multi storey projecting bays and a style variation originating with leading foreign architects.

Historically the property belonged to the Milner family, owners of a prominent carriage works and later a furniture company. Mrs. Milner was a recognized artist whose works are housed in the museum.
