

BY-LAW NUMBER 1987- 99

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE CERTAIN PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF
PETERBOROUGH UNDER THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, 1974

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF PETERBOROUGH BY THE COUNCIL THEREOF ENACTS AS
FOLLOWS:

1. The hereinafter described property be and it is hereby designated to be of historic or architectural value or interest pursuant to the provisions of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974:

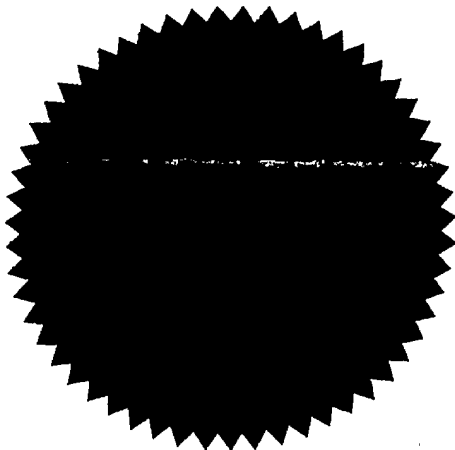
THE PAGODA BRIDGE - jackson Park

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Peterborough, in the County of Peterborough and Province of Ontario and being composed of all of that part of Lot Number.1 west of Communication Road formerly Township of Smith and now City of Peterborough and lying west of Fairbairn Street in the said City of Peterborough.

REASON FOR DESIGNATION

The bridge over a section of Jackson Creek is a fine example of Victorian garden architecture in the same genre as gazebos, pavilions, greenhouses and conservatories. The curved hipped roof gives the structure a somewhat oriental character and is likely the reason for the misnomer of a "pagoda" bridge. The fascia is also decorative and similar to the bargeboard on homes of the same era. The roof boasts tiny dormers which appear to be birdhouses and the ridge sports to finials.

Read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 19th day of May, 1987.
