Mr. R. Sheeny of Peterborough, under the supervision of
Father Trayling. Its tall spire that dominates the skyline
of Orillia, and the extravagant use of stained glass and
marble, make it an edifice truly worth preservation.

- b) The Orillia Presbyterian Church, 99 Peter Street North,
Orillia, Ontario.

Reasons for the proposed designation:

The Orillia Presbyterian Church has been recommended for
designation for historical and architectural reasons. The
building was completed in 1889, under the service of Rev.
R.N. Grant. Designed by Architects Gordon and Helliwell of
Toronto, the structure with its three towers employs a variety
of design features, and compliments the older residential
area in which it is located.
