TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Orillia intends to designate the properties, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal addresses, as properties of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

a) The Church of The Guardian Angels, 115 West Street North, Orillia, Ontario.

Reasons for the proposed designation:

The Church of The Guardian Angels has been recommended for designation for historical and architectural reasons. It was built in 1911, entirely of natural limestone by Mr. R. Sheeny of Peterborough, under the supervision of Father Trayling. Its tall spire that dominates the skyline of Orillia, and the extravagant use of stained glass and marble, make it an ediface truly worth preservation.

 b) The Orillia Presbyterian Church, 99 Peter Street North, Orillia, Ontario.

Reasons for the proposed designation:

The Orillia Presbyterian Church has been recommended for designation for historical and architectural reasons. The building was completed in 1889, under the service of Rev. R.N. Grant. Designed by Architects Gordon and Helliwell of Toronto, the structure with its three towers employs a variety of design features, and compliments the older residential area in which it is located.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the City of Orillia before the 15th day of November, 1979.
