

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Orillia intends to designate the property, including land and building, at the following municipal address as property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

a) The Macnab House, 82 Tecumseth Street, Orillia, Ontario

Reasons for the Proposed Designation

The Macnab house was built in 1905 and is a good example of two storey brick building erected by the merchant class at the time. The property is corner lot with steep slope and high limestone retaining wall at the rear. The building may be described as basically a classical revival style of architectural design with many of the Queen Anne elements either adapted or modified. The residence was built by Clarence Leroy Macnab. He had established a prominent hardware store, Macnab and Sons, on Mississaga Street in 1892 which lasted nearly a century.
