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
A By-law to designate certain buildings to be of historical significance.


WHEREAS it is deemed desirable by the Council of the Town of Napanee that certain buildings within the Town be designated as buildings of historical significance.

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted as a by-law of the Town of Napanee by the Council thereof as follows:

- (1) That the following buildings in the Town of Napanee be designated as buildings of historical significance:
  - (a) 116-118 John Street. Lot 1, west side of John Street  
Former Public Utilities building, now owned by [REDACTED]
  - (b) 52 Dundas St. East. Lot 2, south side of Dundas.  
New York Cafe - owned by [REDACTED] former Oddfellows Hall
  - (c) 42 Dundas St. East. Lot 4 south side of Dundas and Lot 3 and part of  
Lot 4 north side of Mill Street.  
Richelieu Hotel owned by [REDACTED]

This by-law will become effective on the date of its passing. By-law read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 9th day of January 1984.
