

IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, 1974, S.O. CHAPTER 122

AND IN THE MATTER OF THE LANDS MUNICIPALLY KNOWN AS CHRISTIE'S CEMETERY, LOCATED IN PART BLK P, PLAN M1391, NORTH WEST CORNER OF WARDEN AVENUE AND FINCH AVENUE EAST IN THE CITY OF SCARBOROUGH IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Scarborough has decided to designate the lands, known municipally as Christie's Cemetery, as a property of historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O., Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

CHRISTIE'S CEMETERY is recommended for designation for historical reasons, being one of the first Methodist cemeteries established in Scarborough. Established in 1846, the cemetery contains the interred remains of not fewer than 36 pioneers who settled in the 19th century L'Amoreaux community. While the church was dismantled and moved in 1936, most of the monuments erected on the site remained and those not free standing have been appropriated mounted in a memorial stone wall. The free standing monuments and the flat markers mounted in the wall are also included as part of the reasons for designation.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of June 1, 1994.
