Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 17th and 19th days of September, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 999 Queen Street West, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122. The reason for the proposed designation is that the property is a notable example of the work of John G. Howard, one of Toronto's earliest architects. The building is both a fine example of the adaptation of the classical style to the needs of a large building, and an example of the most progressive concepts in institutional design in the period. The historical interest of the building is strengthened by its role in the evolution of treatment methods in mental health. The building is also very important in the local context, for the ordered green space around it and for the landmark status of its dome at the southern end of the axis of Ossington Avenue.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of September 26th 1975.
