Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Waterloo has passed By-law No. 81-11 designating the Bank of Montreal Building, 3 King Street South, in the City of Waterloo to be of historic value and interest pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974.

BY-LAW NO. 81-11

BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE BANK OF MONTREAL BUILDING, 3 KING STREET SOUTH, IN THE CITY OF WATERLOO TO BE OF HISTORIC AND ARCHITECTURAL VALUE AND INTEREST.

WHEREAS Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes Council of a municipality to designate property within the municipality to be of historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS Council for The Corporation of the City of Waterloo deems it desirable to designate the Bank of Montreal Building, 3 King Street South to be of historic and architectural value and interest;

AND WHEREAS the Clerk of the City of Waterloo has caused Notice of Intention to Designate to be given in accordance with Section 29(3) of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974;

AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection has been served on the Clerk within the meaning of Section 29(5) of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF WATERLOO ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- The property described in Schedule "A" attached hereto is hereby designated to be of historic and architectural value and interest.
- 2. Section 33 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 shall apply only to the following exterior elevations of the Bank of Montreal Building:
 - (a) The North or Erb Street facade of said building, measuring approximately twelve and two-tenths (12.2) of a metre in length;
 - (b) The East or King Street facade of said building, measuring approximately twenty-one and three-tenths (21.3) of a metre in length;

- (c) The West facade of said building, measuring approximately twenty-one and three-tenths (21.3) of a metre in length.
- 3. This By-Law shall come into effect on the final passing thereof by the Council of The Corporation of the City of Waterloo.

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Waterloo, in the Regional Municipality of Waterloo and in the Province of Ontario and being composed of Part of The Mill Square (John Hoffman's Survey), according to Registered Plan Number 385 for the said City of Waterloo and designated as PART 1 on a Plan of Survey deposited in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of Waterloo North (No. 58) as Plan 58R-3232.
