HERITAGE DESIGNATION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Waterloo intends to designate the hereinafter mentioned property to be of historic and architectural importance within the meaning of Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990.

The subject lands of the Grand Trunk Railway (GTR)/Canadian National Railway (CNR) Station, are located on Regina Street South, Lots 13 to 17, German Company Tract and are owned by the City of Waterloo.

The existing train station was built in 1910 by the Grand Trunk Railway which was absorbed by The Canadian National Railway System in 1917.

Architecture to be designated includes all four facades, the entire roof line and the interior vaulted ceiling.

The building is constructed in a style typical of Grand Trunk Railway Stations. This Romanesque building has some significant characteristics, such as the sweeping hipped roof with flared eaves, the ticket office window that extends above the roof line and buff brick exterior with cut stone trimming around windows, doors and corners.

Notice of objection to this designation may be served on the Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Waterloo within thirty days of this notice. Any notice of objection shall indicate the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. The last day for filing an objection is Friday, September 29, 1995.
