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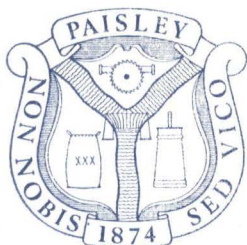

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TO: The Corporation of the
Village of Paisley,
Paisley, Ontario.

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Paisley, on the 19th. day of July 1976 decided to designate the land and building municipally known as the Hose Tower ; as a property of historical and architectural value or interest under the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Hose Tower, on the Market Square, built in 1891, is recommended for designation for architectural reasons, as it is a rare example of a free standing frame hose drying tower of the late nineteenth century. Historically the tower has served as a symbol and headquarters for the activities for the Paisley Fire Brigade which has served the Community since 1888. The Tower's prominent position on the east side of the market square adds a necessary definition to the square and provides a monumental focal point to many of the Village streets.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served in writing, on the Clerk, within 30 days of the 22nd. day of July 1976.
